


A WARNING

- 1. Read, understand and follow all instructions before operating this device.
- Do not exceed rated capacity.
- 3. Use only on **hard**, **level** surfaces.
- 4. Center load on saddle.
- 5. Use as a matched pair to support one end of a vehicle only. One pair per vehicle only.
- 6. Jack stands are not to be used to simultaneously support both ends or one side of a vehicle.
- 7. No alterations shall be made to this jack stand.
- 8. Failure to heed these warnings may result in personal injury or property damage.
- 9. Before working on the car check the stability of the stands by rocking the car back and forth.

Maintenance & Inspection

- Visual inspection shall be made before each use of the stands, check for cracks on the post, cracked welds on the base and missing and/or damage parts. Stands that appear to be damaged in any way shall be removed from service immediately.

Operating Instructions

- 1. Refer to your vehicle owner's manual for proper jacking procedures lift only on areas of the vehicle as specified by vehicle's manufacturer.
- 2. Position stands under vehicle at points specified by vehicle manufacturer as proper load support points.
- 3. To adjust stands: Lift the post to desired height. Push control lever down to lock pawl in place. MAKE SURE PAWL IS FULLY ENGAGED INTO TEETH.
- 4. Insert the safety pin.
- 5. Carefully and slowly lower load onto stands.
